If there's any way the devil can get your eyes away from the Word, he'll do it. He'll cause trouble. He'll make the circumstances around you rock and roll like a rowboat in a hurricane. He'll do anything he can to get you to concentrate on the realm of the physical senses and the situation around you instead of on the promise of God.

That's what he did to Peter. When Peter first jumped out of the boat that day in response to Jesus' word, what happened? He walked right across that water without a problem. His whole being was fastened on that word Jesus had spoken to him, "Come!" But when he took his eyes off that word, he started looking at the storm. He started looking at the impossible thing he was doing. After all, he was a fisherman. All his training and experience told him when the waves were that high, you were going under. He started to focus on what he knew in the natural instead of what Jesus said. When he did that, his faith slipped out of gear and he started to sink.

Has that ever happened to you? Life presses in and we get drawn in to the worry of life and the circumstances surrounding us. Don't get me wrong – life in this world can throw some nasty things on our doorstep and we've all had our share of doubt and worry. But when those moments of angst or fear come knocking, embrace the Word of promise: *Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. SPOTLIGHT ON MISSION GRANTS GRANT #4 ~~ VOICE OF CARE

This grant from LWML-NID provides for materials used in training and offsets some of the cost of staffing.

Voice of Care's mission is to equip the Church to nurture people with disabilities and their caregivers in their walk with Christ. The main focus of Voice of Care's ministry is to develop a comprehensive program in congregations to reach out to people with disabilities in their community, most of whom are unchurched. This is done through consultation on adaptive Christian education materials, training in respite care, and developing inclusive programs. After the initial consultation and training, Voice of Care stays with the congregation until they feel they can run the program on their own, usually about three months. Voice of Care also supplies camps, such as Walcamp, with training for staff members to lead their Special Needs Camp and the curriculum adaptation needed. Another aspect of its training is for individuals who want to do "Jesus Time" devotions in secular facilities, when the people in these facilities are unable to attend church in their community due to their particular disabilities.

While individuals and congregations support the salary expenses of the staff of three pastors and one deaconess, the basic operational costs of the ministry are covered through fundraisers and donations from organizations. The LWML NID is providing such support this biennium with a grant of \$22,000. Our mites are helping to provide resources, printing of materials, mileage, insurance, and many other day-to-day costs of running this ministry. This "behind the scenes" support allows Voice of Care to provide their services free of charge so that a congregation of any size can be trained to reach out with the love of Jesus to people who have disabilities.

Word of Life LWML Supports Orphan Grain Train Hygiene Kit Project

This summer, the women of Word of Life Lutheran Church in Naperville (Zone 22) assembled 30 hygiene kits which were donated to the Orphan Grain Train. The Orphan Grain Train is a Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the world. Grain Train volunteers gather donations of clothing, medical supplies, food, Christian literature, and other aid to meet real needs. The Orphan Grain Train movement is a loving response to Jesus Christ's example as a servant and His love for us.

Supplies for the project were purchased with funds from Thrivent Financial. The Hygiene Kits included a bath towel, wash cloth, bar of soap, tooth brush, comb, deodorant, band aids and a recycled copy of the Portals of Prayer devotional.

Bethel, Gurnee will host the Zone 1 Fall Workshop. The ingathering will collect newborn items for the layette ministry of Love, INC. The ladies will also tie or knot quilts for that ministry.
